




In a first, seven products of any Union Territory have received the GI tags at one go — Nicobari Mat (Chatrai-hileuoi), Nicobari Hut (Chanvi Pati-Nyi hupul), Nicobari Hodi (Outrigger Canoe), Padauk Wood Craft, Andaman & Nicobar Coconut, Nicobari Tavi-i-Ngaich (Virgin Coconut Oil), & Andaman Karen Musley Rice. Other products are also in the process of receiving the GI tag.

BENEFITS OF GI TAG


The GI tagged virgin coconut oil is made from organic coconuts using traditional technique by Nicobarese tribal families, tuhets and Self Help Groups. VCO is not subjected to high temperatures, solvents procedures and therefore retains the fresh scent and taste of coconuts. The VCO has great demand during the traditional feasts and festivals, and amongst tourists also. With the grant of GI tag, it will help the producers to reach the wider market and customers to buy the authentic products of the Islands.














REPUBLIC DAY SPEECH OF THE HON'BLE LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR

On the Auspicious Republic Day of 2025, the Honourable Lieutenant Governor Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Admiral D. K. Joshi, PVSM, AVSM, YSM, NM, VSM(Retd), delivered a comprehensive address outlining significant initiatives across various sectors, emphasizing the Administration's commitment to holistic development. He emphasized that the A&N Administration is committed towards timely implementation of major decisions regarding 100% power generation from renewable energy by the year 2029, 100% coverage under the Pradhan Mantri Surya Ghar Free Electricity Scheme by the year 2027, study of health condition and need of medical experts in the Islands to be completed in the next 2 months, Odisha-Diglipur Optical fiber project, flag hoisting and drone photography on all the Islands.

He also informed that the first flight operation between Kuala Lumpur-Sri Vijaya Puram started in 16th November 2024. Under RCS-UDAN, service will commence soon in Sri Vijaya Puram - Shibpur and Carnicobar sector. The construction work of the Civil Passenger Terminal building at Campbell Bay Airport is likely to be completed by April, 2025. To strengthen Air Connectivity in the Islands and to connect Sri Vijaya Puram with Swaraj Dweep, Shaheed Dweep and Long Island, Sea-Plane demo was successfully carried out on Nov. 17, 2024.



FLAG HOISTING ACROSS ISLANDS


The Andaman and Nicobar Islands comprises a total of 836 islands—533 in the North and Middle Andaman, 159 in South Andaman, and 144 in the Nicobar. In a historic tribute to India's armed forces, Prime Minister, Shri. Narendra Modi renamed 21 islands in honor of Param Vir Chakra recipients. Among these are Ekka Dweep, Hoshiar Dweep, and Banna Dweep—a gesture that embeds the valour and legacy of India's military personnel into the very geography of the nation.

The 76th Republic Day celebrations on January 26, 2025, were marked by extensive flag-hoisting events throughout the islands. Commencing on January 7, the flag hoisting activities culminated on January 26, with the data from each island subsequently uploaded to the PM Gati Shakti portal. Out of the 836 islands in the Andaman and Nicobar Islands, flags were successfully hoisted on 744 islands. This initiative was undertaken by teams from the Administration Department, Forest Department, Police, Coast Guard, and Revenue Department. On some islands, logistical challenges posed by high tides and natural barriers necessitated flag hoisting from boats, with drone photography capturing these moments. On 26 January, Flag Hoisting was done in all the inhabited islands of A & N Islands.

Today, the Andaman and Nicobar Islands stand as a symbol of resilience, national pride, and environmental splendour, with the 76th Republic Day celebrations marking yet another historic moment in their enduring legacy.





A JOURNEY THROUGH SPACE AND TIME



The wild life includes spotted deer, wild boar, gecko and crab-eating macaque and python in the southern Islands.

Sri Vijaya Puram- the capital and gateway to the islands lies in South Andaman Island and falls under South Andaman District. These islands also have historically significant landmarks viz. Cellular Jail, Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose Island, Viper Island, Hopetown and Mount Manipur.

CULTURAL SPLENDOUR OF NANCOWRY ISLANDS


Nestled in the heart of the Nicobar Islands, Nancowry group of Islands stand as a testament to the Nicobarese people's resilience and cultural pride, making it a fascinating place where tradition and heritage continue to thrive amidst changing times.


The Nicobarese tribe living in Nancowry (Nang-kauri or Muot) are known for their deep respect for nature, living in harmony with the environment. Their economy is primarily based on fishing, hunting, and horticulture, with coconut and arecanut cultivation playing a crucial role in their livelihoods. Traditional canoes, called Hodi, are expertly crafted from a single tree trunk, showcasing their remarkable maritime skills.

They follow a distinct socio-political system, where each village functions as an independent unit governed by an elected headman, known as the Captain or Chief. Elders play a significant role in decision-making, ensuring that traditions and customs are upheld across generations. In 1982, Rani Lachmi decided to introduce the system of electing village captains through the ballot box. In 1992 Tribal Councils (also referred to as "Island Councils") were established in the Nicobars. Functioning like a mini-government of an island, the Tribal Councils are the only institutions officially recognized by the Indian Government. The "TUHET" or large joint family is mostly prevalent in Car Nicobar island of Nicobars district.















At the turn of the twentieth century, Nicobarese houses increasingly became rectangular due to the influence of Indian and Burmese traders who set up shops and trading posts in Car Nicobar. Their huts can be distinguished from standard ones by the presence of Kareau (ancestral statues), an assortment of Hentakoi (ritual objects), and the jaws of pigs sacrificed at the last feast. Kareau are human figures carved out of wood found mainly in the central and southern islands. Generally lifesize, all Kareau represent a male figure who is mostly dressed in a loincloth called a Ning.

The Nicobarese most closely identify themselves with their name Tuhet or Kamuanse. These are not necessarily named for the founder (for example, a well-known Kamuanse in Nancowry is called Nyi-Halek, meaning "house of tremendous hospitality".

The Nicobarese community has several festivals of traditional as well as Christian origin, which is celebrated with a grand feast. Music & Dance are key components of Nicobarese festivals.

Dancing is always accompanied by singing. The Nicobarese dance is a circular dance performed near the houses. There is a leader in a monotonous concerted sound and then the dances step right and left under his direction, and jump in unison, coming down on both heels. The Nicobarese are musical people, and sing clearly and well in unison. The most popular musical instrument is Guitar.

The Ossuary or the Pig Festival is a much celebrated traditional festival, accompanied with Hodi (canoe) race, pig fighting and stick fighting. Christmas is the Nancowrie Island's month long celebration, where carol singing parties go for all night long carol rounds across the island and spread the festive spirit to all Islanders.

Only the lucky few can experience all these elements as the Nancowrie Islands are prohibited area under PAT Regulations..

HARITAM – A WINDOW TO APPRECIATE OUR NATURE & BIO-DIVERSITY

Towards the fulfilment of its mandate to reach out to diverse stakeholders and residents of Andaman & Nicobar Islands, the Middle Andaman Forest Division has conceptualized and set up 'Haritam- the Nature Interpretation Centre (NIC) in Uttara Jetty, Kadamtala. Located amidst the salubrious backdrop of lush green mangrove forests the series of 7 eco-huts stand on stilts in the Humphrey Creek overlooking the Azad Hind Fauj Setu that connects Baratang Island to Middle Andaman Island. This is a significant step towards environmental conservation and sustainable tourism. The initiative is expected to become a cornerstone of ecological education and rural development in the Middle Andaman Region.

Featuring informative displays, interactive exhibits and easy to understand models, the NIC provides deep insights into the Forest ecosystem, conservation strategies, and indigenous communities, in particular, the Jarawas. The NIC is equipped with displays detailing the indigenous flora, as well as the marine and terrestrial fauna of the islands in eco-huts each highlighting a specific aspect. The exhibits provide visitors with a comprehensive understanding of the region's bio-diversity and the intricate balance between its land and aquatic habitats.

Another key attraction of the NIC is the exhibition on the culture, lifestyle, and





traditional hunting methods of the indigenous Jarawa tribe. These exhibits offer visitors a rare opportunity to learn about the unique heritage of the Jarawas, their deep connection with nature and traditional way of life. The display includes their Hunting Equipment like arrows and fishing net and also day to day use items like Bamboo baskets and traditional torch (Mashaal).


Haritam also show cases the Timber Extraction process in the forests of Andaman giving a bird's eye view to various stages of timber extraction, from identification and felling of trees to transportation of logs for conversion. The exhibit highlights the sustainable practices adopted to ensure minimal environmental impact. Through displays, visitors gain understanding of the role of the Forest Department in the region and the importance of responsible resource management.

Haritam has already grabbed the attention of residents and visitors to North & Middle Andaman Island in view of its location being very close to the National Highway-4. The local PRIs have welcomed this initiative of The Forest Department in bringing our Nature within easy reach.
