

INAUGURATION OF FIRST SUB-OFFICERS COURSE AT A&N FIRE & EMERGENCY SERVICES TRAINING CENTRE

On 15th July 2025, the Hon'ble Lt. Governor, A&N Islands and Vice-Chairman, Islands Development Agency, Admiral D.K. Joshi, PVSM, AVSM, YSM, NM, VSM (Retd.), inaugurated the first batch of the Sub-Officers Course at the A&N Fire & Emergency Services Training Centre in the presence of Dr. Chandra Bhushan Kumar, IAS, Chief Secretary, Shri Hargobinder Singh Dhaliwal, IPS, DGP, and other dignitaries. This milestone establishes the State Training Centre as the 11th centre in India recognized by the National Fire Service College, Nagpur. A total of 30 officers from GAIL, Gujarat Fire Services, Bihar Fire Services, and MIDC will undergo 25 weeks of intensive training, enhancing fire safety capabilities across the nation.



SUCCESSFUL COMPLETION OF HOME GUARD **VOLUNTEERS ENROLMENT PROCESS**

Volunteers has been successfully concluded with a strong focus on inclusive representation. The recruitment process ensured participation from Nicobari Local Tribes, Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (Great Andamanese & Onges), women candidates, and ex-Home Guard volunteers with commendable service. Conducted in a fair, transparent, and meticulous manner, the selection also includes candidates with qualifications in Hotel Management, Computer Applications, and ITI trades.

YOUNG OFFICERS' CONFERENCE FOCUSES ON STRENGTHENING MODERN POLICING

On 5th August 2025, a Young Officers' Conference was held at the PHQ Conference Hall in connection with Recommendation of the DGsP/IGsP Conference-2024. The session covered key themes such as new-age crimes including crypto and Al-based frauds, use of Al for efficient governance, coastal security, community outreach, and urban policing. Young officers of the Andaman & Nicobar Police actively participated, sharing insights and strategies to enhance modern policing and strengthen law enforcement frameworks across the Islands.

As part of the Special Drive (Pakhwada: 16-30 September 2025) for the disposal of seized drugs, the Andaman & Nicobar Police incinerated 53.96 kg of Methamphetamines on 16th September 2025. This decisive action underscores the force's unwavering commitment to ensuring a Drug-Free Andaman and safeguarding the health and well-being of the community.



CAPACITY BUILDING PROGRAMS

IRBN LAUNCHES SOLAR PANEL INSTALLATION & MAINTENANCE TRAINING PROGRAM

The India Reserve Battalion (IRBn), A&N Police, in collaboration with the Government Industrial Training Institute (ITI), Sri Vijaya Puram, commenced a 10-day training program on Solar Panel Installation & Maintenance for 20 IRBn personnel on 28th July 2025. This specially designed course aims to develop technically skilled manpower capable of maintaining solar energy systems at various remote Look Out Posts (LOPs) across the Andaman & Nicobar Islands, promoting sustainability and self-reliance.



FINANCIAL AWARENESS CAMP HELD AT POLICE HEADQUARTERS

To promote financial literacy among police personnel, a Financial Awareness Camp was organized on 13th September 2025 at the PHQ Conference Hall by SBI officials. TB AWARENESS CAMP ORGANIZED AT IRBN HEAD-QUARTERS

On 22nd July 2025, the India Reserve Battalion (IRBn), A&N Police, in collaboration with ANIIMS, organized a TB Awareness Camp at the IRBn Headquarters to educate personnel about Tuberculosis and its prevention. Dr. Amrita Burma, Assistant Professor (Community Medicine), conducted an insightful session on TB symptoms, transmission, prevention, and MDR, while Dr. Akansha and Dr. Yashika, Junior Residents, further enriched the discussion with expert talks. A total of 100 personnel benefited from this informative and health-focused initiative.

On 23rd July 2025, the India Reserve Battalion (IRBn), A&N Police, in collaboration with Heartfulness, launched a 3-day meditation workshop to promote mental wellness among personnel. On 16th August 2025, a Jan Sunwai was held at Pokkadera Panchayat Hall, chaired by Ms. Shweta K. Sugathan, IPS, SP(D) N&MA, with Shri Ankesh Yadav, DANIPS, SDPO Diglipur, and Insp. Abdul Sajeed, SHO PS Mayabunder. Over 60 participants, including Pradhans, Up-Pradhans, PRI members, and local residents, raised concerns on drug abuse, drunken driving, stray cattle, road safety, and traffic awareness. SP(D) N&MA assured timely action and conducted an awareness session on drugs and traffic discipline.





STUDENTS VISIT CYBER CRIME POLICE STATION AND CAW CELL FOR AWARENESS

On 29th July 2025, 98 students from St. Mary School, along with their teachers, visited the Cyber Crime Police Station and the Crime Against Women (CAW) Cell. The interactive session focused on cyber safety, digital responsibility, and women-centric laws, aiming to nurture informed and responsible citizens of tomorrow.



Similarly, on 23rd August 2025, a Jan Sunwai at Gram Panchayat Hall, Kalighat was chaired by Ms. Shweta K. Sugathan, IPS, SP(D) N&MA, along with Shri Ankesh Yadav, DANIPS, SDPO Diglipur, and SI S.N. Halder, SHO PS Kalighat. Over 80 participants, including Pradhans, Zilla Parishad members, PRI members, and local residents, voiced concerns on illegal liquor sales, traffic and parking, police deployment, and drug abuse awareness. SP(D) N&MA assured swift redressal of grievances and urged the public, including fishermen, to share credible information on illegal activities and poaching, enabling the police to ensure a safer society for all.

STUDENTS VISIT POLICE TRAINING SCHOOL FOR INTERACTIVE LEARNING EXPERIENCE

On 17th September 2025, a group of 20 students from Govt. Sr. Sec. School, Haddo (English & Telugu Medium) visited the Police Training School, Prothrapur. During the visit, students observed demonstrations on police equipment, weapons, and physical training exercises, and were briefed on the roles, functions, and career opportunities within the police force. Shri Uma Shankar, DANIPS, Principal, PTS, interacted with the students, offering valuable insights into policing, while they were also apprised of the newly enacted criminal laws.







A&N TRAFFIC POLICE CONDUCT ROAD SAFETY AWARENESS PROGRAMS FOR STUDENTS

During the period, the Andaman & Nicobar Traffic Police organized a series of traffic awareness sessions across various schools to promote road safety among students. DRUG AWARENESS CAMPAIGNS HELD ACROSS NORTH & MIDDLE ANDAMAN DISTRICT

On 18th and 19th September 2025, a series of Drug Awareness Programmes were conducted across the North & Middle Andaman District, featuring Nukkad Nataks to educate students on the harmful effects of substance abuse. Led by Inspector S. Anandan with the support of PS Mayabunder and IRBn staff, the programmes were held at PM SHRI Model Govt. Sr. Sec. School, Mayabunder, Govt. Sec. School, Mohanpur-5, GSSS Pahal Gaon, GSS Chainpur, and Webi. Over 1,100 students and 50 teachers actively participated, pledging to "Say No to Drugs, Say Yes to Life!"







AWARENESS PROGRAMME BY SOUTH ANDAMAN DISTRICT POLICE

On 25th September 2025, the South Andaman District Police conducted an awareness programme at Govt. Boys Sr. Sec. School, Middle Point, focusing on drug abuse, traffic rules, and cybercrime. The session aimed to educate students on responsible behavior, safe online practices, and the importance of a drugfree lifestyle.

AWARENESS PROGRAMME ON CHILD SAFETY

On 12th September 2025, PS Car Nicobar conducted an awareness programme at GSSS Sawai on the POCSO Act, child rights, and prevention of sexual abuse. A total of 91 students and 7 teachers actively participated, fostering greater awareness and commitment toward child safety.











3-DAY FIRE SAFETY AWARENESS PROGRAMME CONCLUDES AT FSHQ TRAINING CENTRE

The 3-day Fire Safety Awareness Programme held from 5th to 7th August 2025 at FSHQ Training Centre concluded successfully. Participants learned life-saving skills in First Aid, Firefighting, and Disaster Preparedness through hands-on drills, live extinguisher demonstrations, and emergency simulations. Additionally, an exclusive evening session was conducted for 48 teachers and 1 JNRM student from Kendriya Vidyalaya, focusing on essential school safety measures without disrupting classes.

PARAMEDIC SKILLS TRAINING FOR 54TH SUB-OFFICER COURSE TRAINEES

On 21st September 2025, the State Training Centre, A&N Fire & Emergency Services hosted a special team of doctors from GB Pant Hospital for a hands-on and theoretical session on Paramedic Skills, including Basic Life Support, CPR, and Triage, for the 54th Sub-Officer Course trainees. The session provided invaluable training, enhancing the first responder readiness of the participants.



INTERACTIVE SESSION WITH TOURIST VEHICLE OWNERS ON ROAD SAFETY



On 6th August 2025, an interactive session was conducted with the Tourist Vehicle Owners Association, focusing on safe driving, tourist safety, driver conduct, and key road safety norms. Led by the DySP Traffic, the session saw enthusiastic participation from tourist vehicle owners and drivers, promoting responsible and safe practices on the roads.

GOOD WORK



PMF RANGAT RESCUES FISHING TRAWLER CREW

On 18th August 2025, the Police Marine Force Rangat team rescued 5 crew members of the fishing trawler MV Sarveshwaran, which had suffered engine failure off Rangat Bay. Braving heavy rains and squally weather, the team provided first aid and successfully towed the trawler to Rangat Bay Harbour, ensuring the safe return of all fishermen.





In a 2022 South Andaman case, the accused was convicted to 20 years RI, ₹ 10,000 fine, and ₹ 1 lakh compensation to the victim. These judgments highlight the police's dedication to justice and safety of our children.



LANDMARK POCSO CONVICTIONS BY A&N POLICE

The Andaman & Nicobar Police secured convictions in two serious POCSO cases, reaffirming their commitment to child protection. In PS Diglipur Case No. 48/2020, the accused was sentenced to 20 years RI and ₹ 50,000 fine on 25th September 2025.





BRAVERY OF OFF-DUTY POLICE PREVENTS STABBING INCIDENT

On 29th September 2025, off-duty PC Rohan and Elaiza intervened when a lady was stabbed and bystanders hesitated as the assailant held a knife. Displaying courage and quick action, they overpowered and disarmed the attacker, preventing further harm. The accused was arrested and sent to jail.





VISITS BY SENIOR OFFICERS









IGP SINDHU PILLAI VISITS N&MA DISTRICT FOR INSPECTIONS AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

From 1st–2nd September 2025, Smti. Sindhu Pillai A., IPS, IGP (L&O/HQ), accompanied by SP(D) N&MA, Smti. Shweta K. Sugathan, IPS, undertook a two-day official visit to N&MA District. The visit included inspections of PS Mayabunder, SP(D) N&MA Office, OP Rest Camp, and KPSB Rest Camp, with a focus on infrastructure, record maintenance, and operational readiness, along with interactions with officers to assess field-level functioning. A Sampark Sabha was also convened to encourage staff to enhance community engagement and public service delivery.

During the visit, a modern Creche Facility was inaugurated at the DC Office, Mayabunder, in the presence of Smti. Nandini Maharaj, IAS, aimed at providing support to families and working mothers, including police personnel. Additionally, interaction with Karen community leaders was held to strengthen mutual cooperation and community-police relations.

Inaugurated by Smti. Geeta Rani Verma, IPS, IGP ANI, in the presence of Smti. Niharika Bhatt, IPS, Commandant IRBn, the tournament featured 11 teams from various A&N Police units. The opening ceremony was followed by the inaugural match, and in a unique initiative, two local youth players were included in each team to promote community engagement through sports.

Under the initiative "Fitness Ki Dose, Aadha Ghanta Roz", the A&N Police, in collaboration with the Department of Sports and SAI, organized a 3 km cycling rally from Cellular Jail to Netaji Stadium on 24th August 2025, supervised by SP APU Smt. Niyati Mittal. The rally was flagged off by SSP Shri Manoj Kumar Meena, IPS, and SSP Shri Jitendra Kumar Meena, IPS, with 65 participants promoting fitness, healthy living, and eco-friendly transport. ASI Deborah, a world-ranking cyclist, inspired the youth to commit to 30 minutes of daily exercise and cycling for a healthier, greener future.



On 22nd August 2025, the tournament concluded with Team IRBn claiming the title after defeating Team PTS 3-0 in the grand finale. The Valedictory and Prize Distribution Ceremony was presided over by Smti. Geeta Rani Verma, IPS, in the presence of Smti. Niharika Bhatt, IPS, and Shri Uma Shanker, Principal PTS. The event highlighted the A&N Police's commitment to fitness, teamwork, youth empowerment, and strengthening police-community partnerships in the Islands.



SPORTS AND FITNESS

SP CUP FOOTBALL TOURNAMENT 2025 KICKS OFF AND CONCLUDES IN DIGLIPUR

On 15th August 2025, the much-awaited SP Cup Football Tournament 2025 kicked off at Vivekananda Stadium, Diglipur, inaugurated by Shri Kamleshwar Rao, IAS, AC Diglipur, in the presence of Shri Ankesh Yadav, SDPO Diglipur, and other dignitaries. The opening match between GSSS Diglipur and GSSS Subashgram set the tone for an exciting season. The tournament featured 26 teams across U-19 (Boys & Girls) and Opencategories, promoting young talent and seasoned players alike, under the theme "Fight Against Drugs".







The tournament concluded on 25th September 2025 with thrilling matches and enthusiastic crowds. Team Hi-Tech won the Men's Open category, while GSS Keralapuram (U-19 Girls) and Old NFC (U-19 Boys) claimed their respective titles. Winners and participants were celebrated with a cultural show and a pledge for a drug-free, healthier future, marking a true celebration of talent, sportsmanship, and community spirit.









COMMITMENT TO ZERO TOLERANCE TOWARDS ILLEGAL ACTIVITIES



Under NDPS Act, 43 persons were arrested and huge caches of Ganja and synthetic drugs were seized, during this period.

During the Period from July to September 2025, 212 persons were apprehended for selling illicit liquor and 213 Excise cases were registered. Total seizure was 258 bottles of 750 ml illicit liquor and 1673 IMFL bottles of 750 ml each.



Between July-September 2025, 32 Myanmarese poachers were apprehended in North & Middle Andaman. The Indian Coast Guard intercepted 3 poachers near Landfall Island, while joint operations by PS Diglipur, IRBn, and LOP East Island led to 6 more arrests. Additionally, 14 poachers were caught in Nappi Ghope and 9 in Khaal Gora, Elizabeth Bay, and Talbagan, showcasing strong action against illegal poaching.



ANTI-NARCOTICS TEAM BUSTS GANJA SMUGGLING AT VSI AIRPORT

The Anti-Narcotics Police Station achieved major breakthroughs against drug trafficking at VSI Airport, Sri Vijaya Puram. On 17th August 2025, a suspect was arrested with 8.165 kg of illicit Ganja, recovered with the help of the Dog Squad Team. Subsequently, on 25th September 2025, another arrest was made with 3.375 kg of Ganja hidden in a travel bag. Interrogations revealed links with the main supplier, and both cases have been booked under the NDPS Act, 1985.



EXCISE RULES ENFORCED: SOUTH ANDAMAN POLICE RAID DELANIPUR BAR

On 23rd August 2025, based on credible intelligence, Aberdeen Police conducted a surprise raid at a Bar & Restaurant in Delanipur for selling IMFL bottles in violation of its license. Led by Inspector Vishal Ram, SHO PS Aberdeen, the team seized over 1,200 bottles of IMFL and beer and initiated legal action against the buyer and bar manager.
