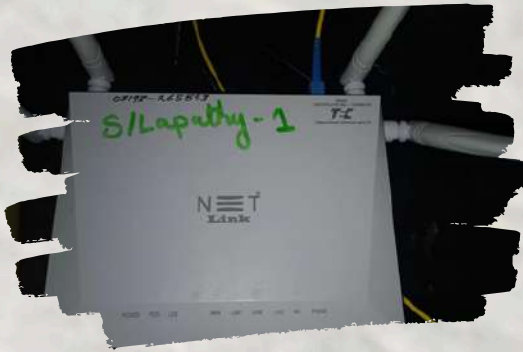


Saksham Anganwadi

Transforming Anganwadi Centres into Smart, Inclusive and Nutrition-Focused Hubs

The Department of Social Welfare, Andaman & Nicobar Administration, is taking significant steps towards strengthening Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE) services through the upgradation of Anganwadi Centres (AWCs) into Saksham Anganwadis. This initiative focuses on creating child-friendly, digitally enabled, and nutritionally supportive environments for holistic development. 140 AWCs covered under the initiative and equipped with 5 components (Wifi, RO water purifier, ECCE material, Smart TV & Poshan Vatika) ensuring improved service delivery

The Saksham Anganwadi initiative is not just an infrastructure upgrade—it is a transformative effort to ensure that every child receives quality care, nutrition, and early education in a supportive environment. By integrating technology, health, and nutrition, these centres are becoming pillars of community development and child well-being.

This progressive initiative reflects the Administration's commitment to building a strong foundation for the future.

Sampoorntha Abhiyan 2.0 by NITI Aayog - Accelerating Development Saturation

Officials Visited the Aspirational District at Nicobar under Sampoorntha Abhiyan 2.0

The Launch of Sampoorntha Abhiyan 2.0 under the Aspirational Block Programme held at Perka Village, Car Nicobar on 9th february 2026. The program was launched by the Deputy Commissioner of the Nicobar District. The six key development indicators targeted under the initiative. These include enhanced coverage of supplementary nutrition for children and pregnant women, proper growth monitoring of children in Anganwadi Centres, functional toilets and safe drinking water facilities in Anganwadis under the Integrated Child Development Services (ICDS), provision of adequate girls' toilets in schools, and vaccination of bovine animals against Foot and Mouth Disease (FMD). The various highlight of the event was Paustik Aahar Mela, Growth Mointoring, PMMVY registration camp and dissemination of Govt. Welfare schemes.



“Men-Streaming Activities” at AWCs in Andaman & Nicobar Islands

Recognizing the important role of fathers and male care givers in ensuring the health, nutrition, care, and development of children, the Directorate of Social Welfare has undertaken several initiatives to promote men's participation in Anganwadi Centre (AWC) activities under the “Active Fatherhood Initiative”. The initiative aims to foster shared responsibility in child care, nutrition, early childhood development, and maternal well-being. As part of this initiative, Men-Streaming activities organized for fathers, grandfathers, community leaders, and other male caregivers are encouraged to actively participate in Anganwadi activities,

The programme saw active participation from Pradhans & PRI members, para medical staff, Anganwadi staff, and community members. The key highlight was the introduction of the “**Buddy Father**” concept, encouraging experienced fathers to mentor others in positive parenting and support in childcare practices. During March 2026, 4,288 activities were conducted with active participation of **1,800** male caregivers.

The initiative successfully emphasized the vital role of fathers/male caregivers in early childhood development, with enthusiastic participation reflecting a growing commitment to responsible parenting.

National Girl Child Day Celebrated on January 2024



A **Beti Janmotsav programme** was organised at Anganwadi Centre (AWC), under ICDS Project Diglipur, marking a significant effort to celebrate and promote the value of the girl child in society.



Under Beti Bachao Beti Padhao (BBBP) initiative, a sport activity for adolescent girls was organized at the SAI Institute, Car Nicobar under ICDS Tribal Project. The Programme aimed to promote Physical fitness, self-confidence & team spirit among the participants.



- The Unique Disability ID (UDID) Project was launched in 2016 by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan) under the Government of India's Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment to provide a unique identity to persons with disabilities and create a national database for strategic welfare planning. The Unique Disability Identity Document (UDID) is an identification card for a person with a disability (PWD).
- The card includes the demographic details and disability related information of PWD across the country. A person having a disability covered under RPWD Act 2016 is eligible for the UDID.

The State Child Protection Scheme, under the Directorate of Social Welfare, has been actively leveraging Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) partnerships to enhance the quality of care and development opportunities available to children residing in **Child Care Institutions (CCIs)** across the Andaman & Nicobar Islands. During the year, in collaboration with Oil India Limited, four major CSR-supported initiatives were successfully implemented, directly benefiting 243 children living in various CCIs.

As part of these initiatives, essential educational and welfare-related infrastructure was provided to the institutions, including Smart TVs, desktop computers, projectors, printers, and water purifiers.

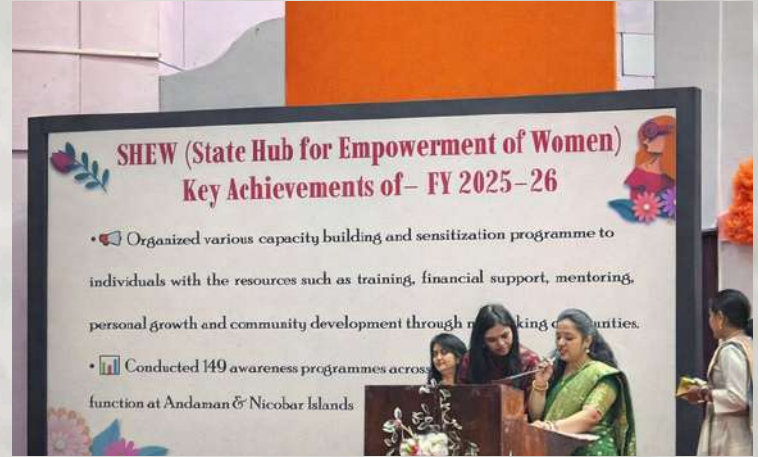

A Landmark Success Story of Compassion, Coordination, and Commitment

NATIONAL HELPLINE FOR SENIOR CITIZENS UNDER DIRECTORATE OF SOCIAL WELFARE FACILITATES INTER-STATE REUNION OF ELDERLY PERSON AFTER 21 YEARS

In a major humanitarian success, the National Helpline for Senior Citizens (NHSC-14567), Andaman & Nicobar Islands, has successfully facilitated the relocation of Shri C. Radhakrishnan, an elderly resident of Abhyudaya Complex Old Age Home, to his native state of Tamil Nadu. Shri Radhakrishnan had been living in the Andaman & Nicobar Islands for nearly two decades and had lost all his identity documents during the 2004 Indian Ocean Tsunami. About six months ago, he was found in a vulnerable condition and later admitted to the Old Age Home at Ferrargunj. During his stay, he repeatedly expressed his strong desire to return to his native place at Kanyakumari District in Tamil Nadu. On his request, NHSC initiated family tracing and inter-state coordination with Tamil Nadu Elderline.

After 3-4 months of continuous efforts involving counselling, police verification, and coordination with Tamil Nadu authorities, his relatives were successfully traced. The Directorate of Social Welfare, Tamil Nadu, has confirmed arrangements for his reception in Chennai and further relocation support to Kanyakumari.

On this occasion, the Director, Social Welfare, Andaman & Nicobar Administration, first congratulated the Elder Helpline team for successfully completing this humanitarian task and enabling Shri C. Radhakrishnan to return home after 21 years. The Director stated that the Elder Helpline not only provides Information, Guidance, Emotional Support, and Field Intervention, but also plays a vital role in reconnecting people who have been separated from their families for decades. He appealed to the public to dial and use the helpline number 14567 as much as possible whenever support is required. He also conveyed his best wishes to Shri Radhakrishnan for a happy and peaceful life ahead and expressed hope that he would live his life well with dignity among his loved ones.

The Administration also acknowledges the support of Shri M.T. Mustafa, President of Island Protection Forum, who generously sponsored Shri Radhakrishnan's air ticket and extended assistance to the Elderline team during the process.

This case stands as one of the biggest success stories of Elder Helpline (14567) in the Andaman & Nicobar Islands, reflecting strong inter-state coordination and the Government's commitment to ensuring dignity and care for senior citizens.

The Administration appeals to the younger generation to stand by their parents, support them emotionally and physically, and ensure that no senior citizen feels abandoned.

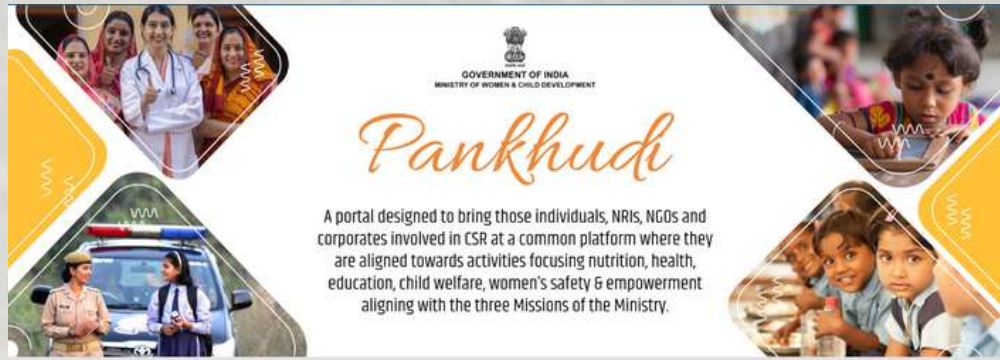

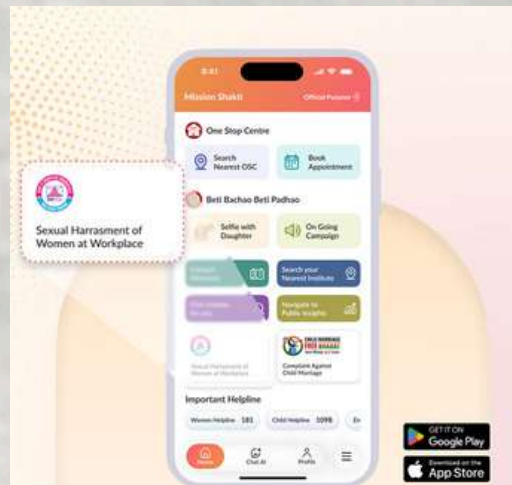
